Key Causes: Voter's perspective

1. A lack of trust
in representatives
(A very large increase in
probability to disengage)



2. A feeling no party
had a **policy vision** (A
large increase in the
probability to disengage)



3. A belief no party
could **effectively handle**
their **priorities** (A
moderate decrease in
engagement)



Performance

4. A belief the
economy had and
would **worsen**
(A slight decrease
in engagement)
